Grand Knight's Faith Message

Why should we adore God? Every person who understands that he is God's creature will humbly recognize the Almighty and adore him. Christian adoration, however, sees not only the greatness, omnipotence, and holiness the divine Love that became man in Jesus Christ. Someone who really adores God kneels down before him or prostrates himself on the ground. This gives expression to the truth about the relation between man and God: He is great and we are little. At the same time, man is never greater than when he freely and devoutly kneels before God. The unbeliever seeking God and beginning to pray can find God in this way.

Why should we petition God? God, who knows us through and through, knows what we need. Nevertheless, God wants us to ask, to turn to him in times of need, to cry out, implore, lament, call upon him, indeed, even to struggle with him in prayer. Certainly God does not need our petitions in order to help us. It is for our own sake that we are supposed to offer prayers of petition. Someone who does not ask and does not want to ask shuts himself up in himself. Only a person who asks opens himself and turns to the Author of all good. Someone who asks goes back home to God. Thus the prayer of petition brings man into the right relationship to God, who respects our freedom.

Decency Report

Presenting the Truth of Catholicism

It seems that building a case for the Faith is a lot like building a mansion one floor at a time. Those outside would be atheists, those inside have various ideas of God.

So what is the foundation of our mansion? Prayer and logic. We need to use reason to demonstrate our faith is true and to show the fallacy of anti-faith arguments.

The Catholic Catechism says that God, infinitely perfect, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to share in in his own blessed life. The ground floor of any discussion: is there a God who could perform miracles and make them more likely to have occurred?

The second floor is Christian apologetics. We go upstairs to the next step in our journey: the revelation of God in the person of Jesus Christ. God revealed himself to mankind extending an offer, salvation from sin. In this step we show that Christian faith is unique, that there is evidence that Jesus lived, died and was seen alive after his death, and that people died for the belief in Jesus' Resurrection and divinity.

By the third floor we have started with a basic belief in God and progressed to trusting Jesus Christ; the next step is to trust the Church that Christ founded. Once we see that Jesus is important, then we should be a part of His Church. We know from investigation that Jesus existed, selected apostles and commissioned them to evangelize the world. The Church has the authority to recognize which books in the Bible are inspired.

There is still one more part of the house to construct: the attic. What goes in there? The most precious things the church has given us: its teachings on morality. Some may be dumbfounded that the church prohibits things like contraception, in vitro fertilization or homosexual behavior. St. Paul says in Romans that the love of God is written on the hearts of men, so even if they don't know God, they know his moral demands.

To keep the context of building up the Faith for someone one step or floor, always be ready to meet them where they are with sound answers for their honest questions.

By-Law Change Vote at Nov 4 Meeting

At the Sept 2 meeting, members voted unanimously to put a change in By-Laws up to a vote of members. Pursuant to By-Law Article IX, proposed changes must be published in the Bulletin 30 days prior to the formal vote. Following is the required information for members, along with a brief explanation of each change (changes are shown as **bold**).

Article I, Sec. 3 ...annual dues of members shall be \$55...

Change: Dues have been \$45 for over 10 years. Current member services cost \$68 and this overdue change narrows the difference.

Article II, Sec. 2 ...election of officers shall be by ballot for contested positions and by voice vote for uncontested positions.

Change: Provides streamlined vote for uncontested positions.

Article V, Sec 1 After reading in of candidate applications, the Grand Knight shall call for a voice vote of acceptance. With unanimous voice

vote approval, candidate will be deemed accepted for admission. If a single objection is presented during the voice vote, the Grand Knight will move to a formal ballot vote defined in Sec. 2

Grand Knight will move to a formal ballot vote defined in Sec. 2.

Change: Provides streamlined vote for uncontested admissions.

Article VI, Sec.2 (a)

- (a) Memorial Committee as required by Article VII.
- (b) Other Committees as may be required by Laws of the Order or these by-laws.

Change: Provides language to define the Memorial Committee as a permanent standing committee of Council.

By-Law changes are an infrequent event, so please plan on attending the Council Meeting on Nov 11. Your participation in this process is important to your Council officers.

Insurance Field Agent Report

Only having "through work" insurance doesn't work
