The Knights in Los Angeles

<u>Celebrating More Than a Century</u> of Historic Columbian Growth in the Golden State

The Knights of Columbus enjoys a robust 117-year history in CA with the fraternity's 2nd ever state council made in Los Angeles Jan 26, 1902. That was the day Council #621 followed San Francisco's #615, chartered 1 week earlier, and became the 1st officially sanctioned chapter in what was then the Diocese of Monterey-Los Angeles. It was a cause for celebration according to the Los Angeles Herald, which reported that 621's 45 charter members joined nearly 50 other Knights from around the nation with Bishop George Montgomery at the Angelus Hotel, located at 4th and Spring streets, for a festive banquet at which "wit and eloquence" flowed in abundance.

The Brothers who reveled at the downtown hotel on the evening of Jan 27, "made merry" while offering toasts to 91-year-old Pope Leo XIII and US President Theodore Roosevelt, as well as to the Clergy and Fraternity. The Angelus was the preferred ceremonial venue for Council 621 members during their earliest years. Meetings were held at a temporary hall located on First and Spring streets, prior to the building of a permanent club house at 612 South Flower Street in 1914. The ranks of CA's Knights continued growing during the order's first 2 years in the state, and after degrees were conferred in LA on May 24, 1903, a sufficient number of members was met to legalize organization of a state council.

Charity was and continues to be a principal function of the Knights. In 1906, Angelenos contributed thousands of dollars in relief to the people of San Francisco after a great earthquake and fire devastated the city on April 18. When they did, no local entity other than the City of LA itself pledged more to the humanitarian cause than Council 621's general relief committee, which immediately promised to send \$1,500 to their northern neighbors. The Knights did not stop there, however, as what had grown to 16 California councils; including #920 in Santa Monica and #987 in Long Beach, coordinated with other lodges throughout the nation to raise more than \$20,000 for San Franciscans in distress.



The Knights in Los Angeles (continued)

<u>Celebrating More Than a Century</u> of Historic Columbian Growth in the Golden State

Before then, on October 12, 1903, and in accordance with a custom established throughout the east, Council 621 commemorated what was then called Discovery Day by honoring their order's patron Christopher Columbus through a solemn mass held at the Cathedral of St. Vibiana. The religious service became a yearly tradition of the Knights of Columbus in Los Angeles, and through the fraternity's dedicated lobbying of Congress and President Franklin Roosevelt, Columbus Day was established as a national holiday in the United States beginning in 1937.

More than a half century after their fraternal seeds were sown in California's fertile soil, a new council of Knights sprouted at the Westchester Women's Club on October 20, 1953, and according to the book Seventy Years of Service: History of the Knights of Columbus in California 1902-1972: "The Council was formed in response to increase in population and need for a Columbian unit in the area." After the Westchester Knights conducted their 2nd and 3rd Degree initiations at Council 621's hall on November 17, 1953, they were officially granted status as Father Emil Kapaun Council No. 3744. Council 3744's birth took place during the Columbian year of 1953-54, when 14 new chapters were added to California's honor roll. By the end of 1954, there were 158 councils in California, with 31,481 total members. Today, 65 years later, there are more than 700 Knights of Columbus councils in the Golden State, with more than 78,000 fraternal members. The rest of the story... so to speak... is history.
